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| Dispatch Information | Dispatched for a possible cardiac arrest. It is an unresponsive patient who is not breathing at a residence. PD is responding and EMS has been notified. |
| Subjective Information | Upon our arrival to the scene, the patient's wife directed us to the third floor apartment, as this is the patient's residence. The wife hysterically explained that she could not do CPR because she couldn't get the patient to the floor. The patient's wife explained that she awoke and noticed that the patient was not breathing. She tried to wake him up, but could not. She then called 911. The wife stated that the patient had chest pain recently and had an appointment to see his doctor tomorrow. |
| Objective Information | The patient, a 58-year-old male, was found on his bed in cardiac arrest. EMS was updated on the patient's status. The patient has no palpable pulses or spontaneous respirations at this time and has a gray/white skin color. The patient was moved to floor so effective CPR could be performed. Once the patient was on the floor CPR was started and an AED was placed on the patient. CPR is being performed with rotation of the compressors every 2 minutes. An OPA was placed and the patient was ventilated with a BVM connected to high flow oxygen. The BVM is effective at producing adequate chest rise with ventilations and there seems to be no obstructions noted. The AED has advised responders that there is "No shock advised" and CPR was resumed. EMS arrived and report was given to the paramedics. EMS directed us to continue assisting with compressions/CPR and EVAC of the patient. |
| Assessment Information | Cardiac Arrest – Suspected/possible cardiac in nature |
| Plan Information | Arrived on scene, moved patient from bed to floor, began CPR, attached AED, BVM, Oxygen, OPA utilized. Report to EMS when they arrived. Assisted with EMS as directed for the duration of resuscitation. |
